TRUE PROPHETS

In Deuteronomy today we hear that God's very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God's mouth. In Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, one filled with the authority of God's own voice, the Holy One of God. There are, no doubt, both false and true prophets around us today. The whole history of our church is filled with both. Some

false prophets were extremely popular and quite well-versed in scripture, and even held positions of church authority. But in today's Gospel we learn that Jesus' fame spread because he taught with authority; he wasn't an authority because he was popular or famous. Elsewhere, we also learn from him, in his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God's purposes. Today we hear that his authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: by not hardening our hearts when God speaks. If we truly listen to God, it will be God's very words filling our mouths.

Some conservative folks will love today's reading, and liberals will put their hands over their ears. It seems to promote the spirituality of celibacy over and against that of married life. It might imply that a life of holiness is available to priests and religious that is simply not an option for married people. We suspect this has something to do with sex, or the lack thereof; ways of the flesh and ways of the spirit are not reconcilable.

But Paul is more interested in time than in sex when he extols the choice of single life. After all, it has given him more time to put at the service of the Lord. He also believes that Jesus is returning shortly, so starting a family now is poor timing. Paul does not claim to speak for God here, but only for himself. The way he is called to serve the Lord is clearly assisted by a life of celibacy. Yet we have all known many holy women and men who fully served the Lord within the context of the home and marketplace.

Nevertheless, we need holy men and women to serve the Church as nuns and priests, and the Church demands wholehearted dedication from them. Celibacy is required.

This coming weekend, the diocese will sponsor a vocation retreat for those young men who show interest and an inclination to meet the demands and challenges of priesthood. Please pray for them.

IN THE LIGHT

Jack Wheeler

Jack Wheeler, a native of Lake Charles and a parishioner of Our Lady Queen of Heaven for over 45 years, recently competed in his first *Ironman* Triathlon. He completed this arduous *North American Sports* event in 13 hours and 43 minutes at the age of 57.



Jack has always enjoyed athletic events such as swimming, biking, tennis, and even surfing! Just for pure pleasure, he began running while he was a freshman at LSU. Once he started running competitively in 1981, he plunged right into marathons. The first year he completed the Houston Marathon in a total time of 3 hours and 23 minutes. Since then he has run several others, including the New York City Marathon in 1987. He began competing in triathlons in the early 1980s. Jack's goal, for *Ford Ironman Florida*, at Panama City Beach, was 14 hours. On November 1, 2008 he began the grueling 140.6 miles. This consisted of a 2.4 mile swim in the Gulf of Mexico, a 112 mile bike trek and a 26.2 mile run – only to stop for quick transitions. For him this consisted of 1 hour and 26 minutes swimming, 6 hours and 29 minutes biking and 5 hours and 27 minutes running. Jack is pleased that he completed each leg, and he placed 1,691 out of a total of 2,270 participants in this Herculean event.

Jack served as a member of OLQH Finance Council for over 12 years. He is a partner in the law firm of Fraser Wheeler LLP. He is certified by the Louisiana Bar Association Board of Legal Specialization as a Tax Law Specialist and is an Estate Planning and Administration Specialist. Jack holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Accounting and a Juris Doctorate law degree from LSU. After graduating from LSU Law Center he worked as an Attorney Advisor for the United States Securities and Exchange Commission in Washington, D. C. He went on to gain a Masters of Law degree in Taxation from New York University School of Law and a Masters of Law degree in Securities Regulation from Georgetown Law Center in Washington, D.C. Jack is also a certified public accountant. He practices primarily in the areas of taxation, estate planning, trust and estates, corporate and securities law.

Jack met his wife, Brandy DeGabrielle Wheeler, when they were working for the same law firm. Both joined the Lake Area Runners over 25 years ago. They have been married for 23 years and Brandy enjoys the competition just as much as Jack, acting as his coach. Their 20-year old son Alex graduated from St. Louis Catholic High School where he lettered in swimming all four years. He was awarded the Louisiana Outstanding Male Swimmer Award, Division III, for the years 2004 and 2005. Alex is currently in his junior year at the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, where he plays on Notre Dame's water polo team. He is pursuing a double major in finance and film.

Jack stays physically fit to be trained for future competition. His next feat will be *Ironman 70.3 New Orleans* on April 5. Just half the distance as the *Ironman* competition, it's still a huge commitment on Jack's time and lifestyle, but he loves the challenge.

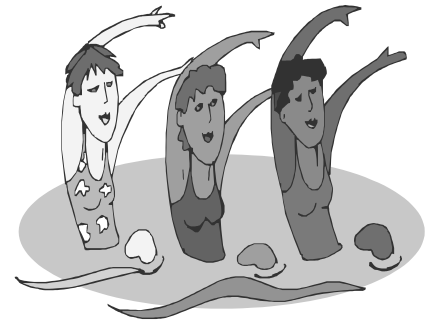
