## IN THE LIGHT

### CAROL HOPPER

“The poorest of the poor need everything, *especially hope*. In the area of health care the needs are unending. Because of this, I have traveled fifteen times as a nurse to Nicaragua, working with other nurses, doctors, pharmacists, dentists, and other health care professionals – a core group of volunteers, all paying their own expenses, bringing their talents and skills. We come together to create a clinical team.” This is Carol Hopper’s message as she speaks passionately about the mission trips she has taken over the years.



Carol, a Catholic Daughter and parishioner of OLQH for over 20 years, is 82 years young and has been married to Kenneth Hopper for 62 years. She is a 1948 graduate of Charity Hospital of New Orleans School of Nursing, and has 48 years of active nursing. Retired for 17 years, her zest for life and love of the heart is expressed in a calm and gentle disposition. She says, “Nurse’s training by the Sisters of St. Vincent de Paul set the stage of preparing me for my ultimate calling – medical missions. Every morning when I awaken, I call on our Creator to manifest vibrant health, love and harmony for everyone this day.”

As a retired Registered Nurse Carol travels with three Catholic missionary groups: Abrazando Cristo, Lake Charles; Knights of Malta, New Orleans; and Cristo Sana, New Orleans. The Propagation of the Faith began the Mother group of Cristo Sana from which the others stemmed. In 1998, at 70 years of age, Carol went on her first Abrazando Cristo Nicaraguan trip. In March of this year Carol Hopper found herself again in the mountain town of Ticuantepe, Nicaragua. Even after 7 trips with Fr. Danny Torres, spiritual director of the group, it is as he told her in the beginning, “Search for the eyes of Christ in those you serve. *Your life will be transformed!*”

Carol has been on 15 mission trips, journaling each one. It is evident in her home *filled* with files and albums from every trip, and a briefcase *full* of photo enlargements that of each other one she comments, “This is my favorite!” Carol explains, “On a typical morning we wake at 5:00, then down to breakfast, morning prayers from the Magnificat, spiritual direction and sharing. We load our bus with supplies and go to a village where there are long lines of poor waiting for us. Some have left home early and walked a long way. Most have respiratory infections, anemia, parasites, asthma, arthritis, hypertension, diabetes, allergies, and skin conditions. It is always overwhelming and we wonder if we can do it. In makeshift clinics doctors begin seeing patients and prescriptions are filled. Nurses are busy with blood pressure and weight, and our interpreters are extremely valuable helping take personal histories. Even though we become exhausted and battered by the heat, we often don’t finish till late into the night so that every patient may be seen. We have Mass and then dinner, if time allows. As we begin the next morning at the same time, we are usually still tired from the day before. But the face of Christ has not been difficult to find – it is in the suffering expressions of the elderly and little ones; or in the patience of all as they wait, sometimes for hours in the heat, most of the time standing; or it may be in the gentle expression of love and trust in a child’s face.”

During her first trip to Ticuantepe, Carol met 10 year-old Karla and her grandmother. “The grandmother asked me to take the child so she could experience a better life in my country. I told her I was too old for that, but I peered into the child’s eyes and told her I would return. I have seen her each visit. Love and trust developed, and now she is a beautiful young woman of 18, with a promising future since she is being educated in the field of computers. The picture above is of us during the medical mission in March.”

Carol continues to answer the call...she knows her Master’s voice and follows it! She says, “It is *everyone’s* call to share with our brothers and sisters and help them when they are in need. We are all one.....no one worth more than any other. My mind is full of the spirit of those people – their patience, appreciation, endurance, calmness and graciousness. I have learned how suffering speaks a universal language, how the face of Christ is everywhere, and how the poorest of the poor need everything, *especially hope*. I will return in August of this year with Cristo Sana. My greatest dream is to share this experience with my great-grandson when he reaches the age of 15.”

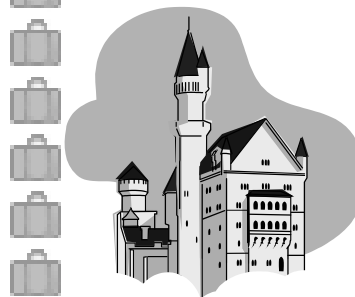

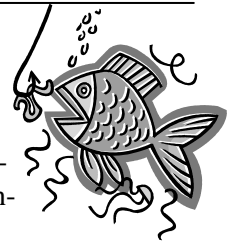

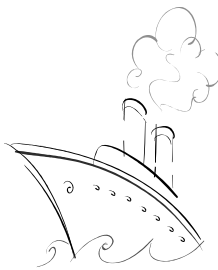


**8TH GRADE REGISTRATION GUIDELINES**

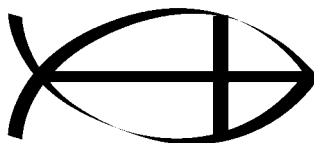



**25TH & 50TH WEDDING ANNIVERSARY MASS**
