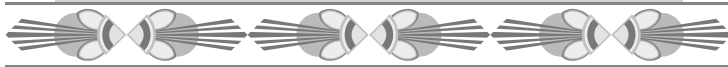


FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

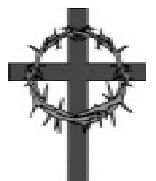

Ainsley DeSonier has been a dedicated and active member of our parish family for many years. She celebrates her 30th birthday today, Easter Sunday. Though we have never heard her *voice*, her witness for and love of Christ comes through loud and clear.

Ainsley was born on April 12, 1979 with a very rare congenital birth defect called Cloverleaf (Kleeblatschadel) Syndrome. She had a total of seven surgeries in her first five months of life; the beginning of many, many surgeries throughout her life. These 'set backs' have not kept her from bouncing back in full spirit with her quick wit and inspirational zeal for life.

Ainsley received her education beginning with Hamilton Elementary, Jack Drost, College Oaks and S.J. Welsh. She received a certificate of completion at her graduation from Barbe High School. She is currently employed as a clerical assistant at Dr. Keith DeSonier's ENT office and keeps busy as a chart/fax runner (and Master Shredder!).

Ainsley is an active member of the Family Choir and keeps everyone on their toes, lending her talent in the percussion section. If you hear a Latin rhythmic flair, that's Ainsley on the maracas. If you hear a pulsing, pounding beat, that's Ainsley on the bodhran (a hand held drum). She has even accompanied well known Irish Balladeer, Danny O'Flaherty. Ainsley's artistic talent doesn't stop with music. She also loves to paint and has completed many beautiful paintings including "Angel in Flight". Two additional loves that Ainsley possesses are dancing and travel. She enjoys whirling around in her wheelchair on the dance floor or being held by a dance partner. She has traveled to Disney Land (CA), South Carolina, Connecticut, Ireland, Spain, and Italy, where she was in a large audience with Pope Benedict, XVI.

Ainsley has other interests in addition to the arts. She is actively involved in politics, volunteering at headquarters, serving as a delegate to the state Republican Convention in Lafayette and even campaigning for her buddy, Governor Bobby Jindal. She was selected to be the national "Miracle Kid" in 1992 for Children's Miracle Network.

Ainsley's 17 first cousins keep her busy organizing parties, bridal and baby showers and many other events. Another thing keeping her busy these days is her new nephew, Isaac Keith, who is the apple of her eye.

Ainsley recently participated in the ACTS Retreat and is thrilled to be part of the OLQH ACTS family.

Not bad for someone who wasn't expected to live more than a few hours! Ainsley and her parents, Keith and Dale, and her siblings, Emery and Keith, Jr. are a testimony to the power of love, faith and commitment.

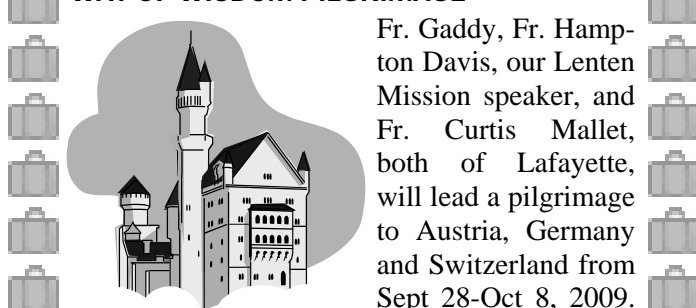

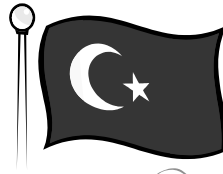

NEW 8TH GRADE REGISTRATION GUIDELINES

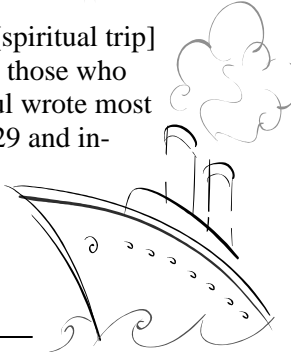
