THE LAMB OF GOD

“Behold the Lamb of God!” We hear this phrase every Sunday at Mass, but there’s a good chance that many Roman Catholics would not know who in the Bible originally spoke this phrase. Some may be surprised that it appears in only one of the four Gospels, and after it is spoken two times, it never appears again. It is John the Baptist who twice utters this phrase in the Gospel of John. In today’s Gospel reading, John proclaims Jesus

as the Lamb of God, and two of John’s own disciples then follow Christ. A little bit later Andrew, who heard John and then followed Jesus, brings his brother Simon to be re-named Cephas, or Peter. A careful look at these Bible verses shows us the mission of everyone baptized into the Body of Christ: We must always proclaim our faith in Christ, so that others will follow him. Even though we do not know how the will of God might work through those we bring to Christ (could Andrew have known the destiny of his brother?), that is not the point. The point is that our ongoing mission as a church—one, holy, catholic, and apostolic—is to bring others to Christ. We do not seek attention, glory, or followers for ourselves, but only for the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

As I write this message for World Religion Day which begins the “Week of Christian Unity”, rockets are raining down on Israel, fired by Muslim terrorists of the Hamas party. In retaliation, Israeli forces are dropping bombs on cities in Gaza and threatening a wholesale invasion. There is also much political unrest and religious persecution around the globe. Fr. Charles Okorougo, who serves as a chaplain at St. Patrick’s Hospital, lives with Fr. Long and me. He shared with us grave fear for his family in Nigeria because of Muslim persecution of Catholics and Christians.

Although most of us are insulated from the violent unrest that exists in these countries, it should make us realize how important understanding, tolerance and freedom of religion is. Scarce attention is paid to prayer for unity of faith, but it doesn’t in any way diminish its importance. Take a moment, at least, this week and say a prayer for peace and understanding among the peoples of the world who are all God’s children.

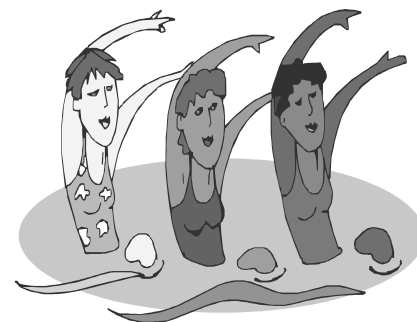

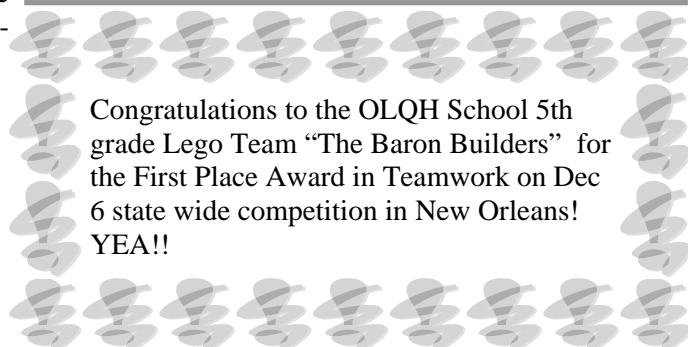

The office will be closed Jan 19 in honor of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.

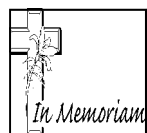

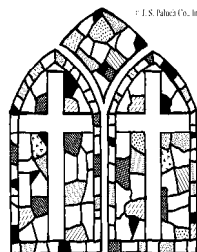
